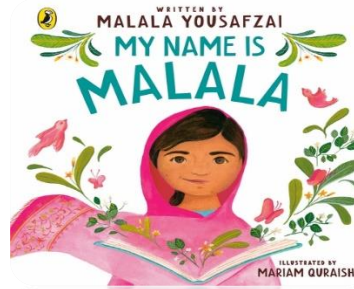

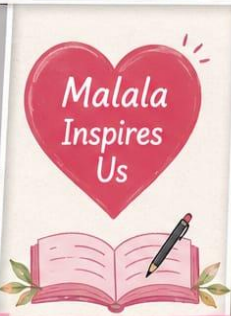

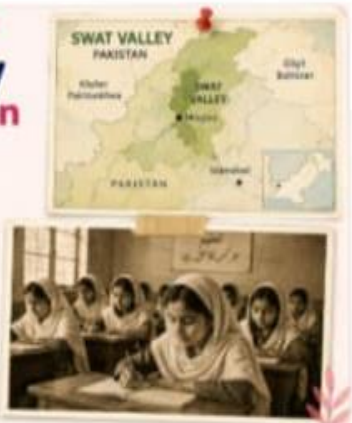
Slide 2: Early Life and Activism

The Journey Begins in Pakistan

Born on **July 12, 1997**, in Mingora, Swat Valley, Pakistan.

Encouraged by her father, an education activist and school owner, she developed a passion for learning.

In 2009, at just **11 years old**, she began writing a **NBC Urdu blog** under a pseudonym (**Gul Makai**) about life and the ban on girls' schooling under Taliban rule.

Slide 3: The Turning Point

Standing Up for What is Right

Malala openly campaigned for the fundamental human right of girls to receive an **education**.

On **October 9, 2012**, she was **tragically shot** in the head by a **Taliban gunman** while traveling home from school.

The attack sparked **global outrage**, leading to **worldwide support** and the **creation of the International Day of the Girl**.

"When the whole world is silent, even one voice becomes powerful."
— Malala Yousafzai
